Hussain deserves credit for his contribution to Urdu literature. It's This. strange love, obsession, strong desires, living with the disease, questioning everything and trying to understand life. It's also about getting caught for alleged murder, horrific torture of police and army recruiting people as spies (emphasizing The Kashmir struggle without naming names). Bug (باگ) is about Assad, who is obsessed with the idea of hunting a tiger/leopard, a kind of person whose mind is constantly trying to join the points of things happening in the world and in his life. He reflects on everything philosophically and suffers from a breathing disease that leads him to hakim (حکیم) in Gumshad. Here he falls in love with Yasmin (Hakim's daughter) - I just like the way they call each other اسدی and اس. Their love story is not your typical, but it is an unexpected roller coaster ride of emotions. You will have to read the book to better understand the events that unfold one by one, when the tragedy strikes and their lives are turned upside down. Days in jail with horrific torture and humiliation by the police as intelligence runs into recruiting boys to send them across the border will keep you hooked. This novel not only delineates the long-term effects of Rizq-e-Haraam on people's lives, but helps in identifying some of the main causes for a disgruntled and disastrous life. If Glong eat meat meat only a dead animal so people who always like to take advantage of weak/disturbed and emotionally dead people. Trying to get what is outside of his/her destination he often chooses the forbidden path that leads him to earn Rizq-e-haraam. The author explains in detail the negative effect of Rizq-e-haraam on the process of mutation of human genes. This can lead to madness and anomaly, which is then genetically transmitted to the next generation. The second point that is strongly emphasized though from the novel is the concept of Ishk-e-Lahasil (love without destination). Love for forbidden desires always leads a person to earn a risk-e-haraam, which, in turn, destroys his life, and in the end a person is left alone with nothing but his dissatisfied life. In order to convince the reader of this question, the characters of zayum and Semi Shah are represented in the novel. Yukum, a member of the middle class, falls in love with Semi Shah, a liberal and beautiful woman who had a true love for her other classmate. Due to some circumstances, Seven cannot marry her lover, and this makes her emotionally upset and weak. At this time of depression and lonliness zaium uses the physical advantage of Semi Shah, but as always remains unsuccessful in emotionally casting her feelings of love for him. It was Ishk-e-Lahasil from zayum. He ran after someone who was never meant for him, and his desire to lead him to the wrong path, and he continued to move in the wrong direction and in the end was left alone with nothing but regret and dissatisfaction. This novel strongly reflects on the negative aspects of our society today. If only we can understand the concept and adverse effects of Rizk-e-haram and learn to firmly believe in Allah and the destiny decided by it, we will probably prosper as a good Muslim and an ideal member of society.
